The Thomson Reuters Making Tax Digital Deferral Opinion Survey

Notes to Editors


867 UK accountants took part in the Thomson Reuters survey, which ran from the 23 July to 1 August 2017.

Results:

- 57% of accountants said the announcement to defer MTD was in line with their expectations, 20% were expecting no change with 19% had been expecting the deferral of income tax to 2019.
- 86% of accountants agreed that the Government has made the right decision to delay MTD. Only 5% disagreed, with 9% saying it is too early to tell.
- 83% of accountants agree with the deferral of quarterly reporting for income tax from April 2018 to April 2010. 10% answered no and 7% were unsure.
- 61% agreed digitising the tax system is the right approach, 27% disagreed and 12% didn't know.
- When asked for their opinion on quarterly reporting being changed to optional for those businesses below the VAT registration threshold, 49% agreed that these businesses should be out of the scope of quarterly reporting, 28% thought these businesses should be encouraged. In contrast, 7% thought all businesses should be included by April 2010 and 13% agreed all businesses should be included, but with a phased approach.
- 29% of accountants think quarterly reporting offers efficiencies, 53% disagreed, and 18% were unsure.
- 63% think quarterly reporting is inevitable for all businesses in the future. 22% disagreed and 15% were
 unsure.
- When asked what their current plans were for supporting MTD quarterly reporting, 47% are continuing with preparation, 35% are going to revisit the requirements next year, 12% will revisit when VAT goes live in 2019.
- Ahead of the recent MTD deferral announce, 48% of firms had taken steps to prepare for MTD, 45% had not taken any steps but planned to and 7% had not taken steps and had no plans to.
- Of those taking steps:
 - 77% had assessed software
 - 71% had assessed clients
 - 62% internal staff meeting
 - 56% reviewed service offering
 - 55% had assessed processes.
- 70% of those who had already taken steps to prepare, say it has highlighted areas of focus for the future.




IS THE ANNOUNCEMENT IN LINE WITH YOUR EXPECTATIONS?





HAS THE GOVERNMENT MADE THE RIGHT DECISION TO DELAY MTD?







DO YOU AGREE DIGITISING THE TAX SYSTEM IS THE RIGHT APPROACH?







DO YOU THINK QUARTERLY REPORTING OFFERS EFFICIENCIES?





DO YOU THINK QUARTERLY REPORTING IS INEVITABLE FOR ALL BUSINESSES IN THE FUTURE?





WHAT ARE YOUR CURRENT PLANS FOR SUPPORTING MTD QUARTERLY REPORTING?








